## **Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> International Diploma (APID)**

#### **Overview**

- The Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> International Diploma is a credential that allows students to demonstrate outstanding academic achievement on AP<sup>®</sup> Exams across several disciplines. The APID also promotes an international outlook. It indicates to colleges and universities that the student has challenged him- or herself in multiple subject areas and has succeeded in a global perspectives course.
- The APID is an optional certificate that is available to students attending secondary schools outside the United States and to students attending U.S. high schools who are applying to universities outside the country. The APID is not a substitute for a high school diploma but rather provides additional certification of academic excellence.
- To earn an APID, a student attending a school within the United States must send at least one AP Grade Report to a university outside the United States.

### **Diploma Criteria**

To earn an APID, a student must earn grades of 3 or higher on at least five AP Exams in the following content areas:

- 1. Two AP Exams from two different languages selected from the English and world languages areas.\*
- 2. One AP Exam designated as offering a global perspective: AP World History, AP Human Geography, or AP Government and Politics: Comparative.
- 3. One exam from the sciences or mathematics content areas.
- 4. One additional exam from among any content area except English and world languages.

\*A student may submit a letter from an administrator at his or her school verifying the student's mastery of a language not currently available within the AP suite of exams. This verification, printed on school letterhead, will satisfy the requirement for one AP Exam in the language category. However, a student who utilizes this option must submit an additional AP Exam from another content area. Thus, all students, however they satisfy the two-exam English and world language requirement, must submit a total of five AP Exam grades of 3 or higher to qualify for the APID.

# Worldwide Recognition of the AP Program

Universities in more than 55 countries outside the United States recognize the AP Program in the admissions process:

- All universities in Canada offer credit for AP courses and examinations.
- Every university in Germany and Austria recognizes the AP Program.
- AP has been mapped against the British A-Level Exams, providing universities a familiar benchmark to evaluate AP Grade Reports.
- AP Program recognition has spread throughout Latin America. Prominent universities in Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Guatemala, Mexico and Uruguay have recently developed strong AP policies.
- The Dominican Republic's National Council on Higher Education has a systemwide policy for the acceptance of the AP Program.
- Several universities in China and Taiwan encourage AP Grade Report submissions. Initiatives are under way in other Asian countries, including India, Japan and South Korea.
